



For 20 years, FUNDarte has been presenting unique, celebratory live arts experiences in the Magic City that speak to our local audiences, and use the power of culture to uplift and educate our community. Our goal is to present the most innovative, risky, honest, and relevant art works from around the world to audiences in Miami and the greater South Florida community. FUND*arte* is proud of the diversity and range of our programming, which focuses on Latinx artists, Spanish-language and bilingual programming, and works by local artists and artists from around the world. Our yearly program season includes several theme-driven series that, over the years, have become micro-festivals reflecting our values and interests.

We bring live theater for children and adults, dance, music, and multidisciplinary arts to local audiences. We present current trends in Flamenco and other genres from Spain and the Americas, showcase the latest musical trends from the Cuban diaspora, and support challenging programs and artists who address complex social issues such as migration, LGBTQIA+ identity, and climate change. FUNDarte is committed to nurturing South Florida-based artists, and connecting local artists to the wider arts field. We provide free workshops serving local artists and the community at large, and support South Florida-based and visiting artists through production and career development opportunities.

After a challenging hiatus from normal presenting activities commencing in March 2020, we are thrilled to be back in full swing for our 20th Anniversary Season. ZUNZÚN CHILDREN'S CHILDREN'S FEST October 1st & 2nd, 2022

The ZunZún Children's Fest is an annual, bilingual performing and literary arts celebration for families and younger audiences that brings together local and visiting artists. This festival promotes the values of *Hispanidad* and the appreciation of its rich cultural traditions. 2022 is ZunZun's eighth edition in collaboration with the Miami-Dade County Auditorium and the Miami Beach Bandshell in collaboration with The Rhythm Foundation and the Arts in The Parks program sponsored by the city of Miami Beach.

The Fundación Cuatrogatos curates the exhibition of illustrations for children's books. It features works by illustrators: Alex Lago (Cuba-United States), Ciça Fittipaldi (Brazil), Claudia Deglioumini (Argentina), Claudia Navarro (Mexico), Héctor Borlasca (Argentina), Israel Barron (Mexico), Roger Ycaza (Ecuador), Romanet Zárate (Bolivia), Vicky Ramos (Costa Rica) y Ximena García, (Argentina).

Companhia Urbana de Dança is firmly positioned in the leading urban dance scene in Brazil and internationally, and choreographer Sonia Destri Lie's boldly original mix of contemporary Brazilian dance and hip-hop infuses both forms with new rigor. Meditative one moment, explosive the next, Destri's approach strips the genre of its easy tricks, finding its original emotional depth, expressive range, and poetic integrity with a unique Brazilian sensibility. Pulling from the peripheral communities of Rio de Janeiro where many of her company members grew up, Companhia Urbana de Dança aims to transcend cultural boundaries, redefining the world favela in the psyche of Brazil and the world by making their dance and their daily work a socio-political—and aesthetic—response to their environment.

Founded in 2011 by choreographer Soon-ho Park, Bereishit is a Seoul-based dance company that takes a contemporary approach to Korean traditional culture, focusing on fundamental values, as opposed to simply borrowing or transforming them. Park's work explores the issues of identity and transformation and delves into multimedia, street dance, community dance work and real time interactive demonstration. With heightened sensitivity towards space and rhythms, the company's captivating performances are delivered with kinesthetic clarity and power.

Soon-ho has done various works and projects with installation and media artists, and musicians, including a collaboration with Giga Hizume, who is the director of Sal Vanilla, a multimedia and live performance group in Japan. He has received major funding from Arts Council Korea, and awards including The Choreography Award of the Year by the Performing Arts and Film Review, The New Choreographer's Award by the International Modern Dance Festival, and the Best Choreography Award both from the Korean Dance Researchers and Critics Association and the ChangMu Arts Center. His work opened the Festival Asia in Barcelona, Spain, in 2007. Since then, Soon-ho's works have been presented at venues and festivals in many countries such as Poland, the United Kingdom, Brazil, Uruguay, India, Switzerland, and Mexico, amongst others.

Funded by Miami-Dade County and in partnership with FUNDarte, the Artist Access Grant Program is designed to assist practicing, professional artists in any medium or discipline residing in Miami-Dade County pursue opportunities that will advance their practice and careers in demonstrable ways.

Eligible opportunities include artistic professional development and skill-building opportunities such as specialized workshops, artist residencies, technique classes with master artists, conferences, teaching artist training, arts leadership training and other noncredit artistic learning opportunities (in person or virtual). Applicants must demonstrate how the potential, timeliness, and impact of the opportunities will forward the artist's career. Artists can receive awards up to \$2,000.

Alex Cuba is a multiple Latin Grammy/Grammy/Juno-winning singer-songwriter with a vast musical vision that draws but is not tied to tradition.
